NAIHC News:

- NAIHC Annual Convention May 16-17-18-19
 - **May 16:** AM: Golf Tournament (Puyallup-owned) AND Service Project (Chief Seattle Club); PM: Legislative Committee, AMERIND First Time Attendee, Regional Caucus

- COVID Impacts Continue, Trainings Remain Online (some in-person available)
 - NAIHC Headquarters staff still in office part-time, teleworking other days
 - Expect to follow DC guidance once it moves to "Phase 3" to resume full inoffice activities
 - Most TTA is still online only, ONAP says they are close to allowing travel
 - Last summer (June), HUD ONAP has informed all TTA providers that on-site TA will not be allowed, due to HUD ONAP travel restrictions; working with ONAP to understand rationale, many tribes asking for on-site only now
 - If Tribes want on-site they need to let HUD know
 - Still finalizing 2022 HUD training schedule, approximately 50 assignments
 - Also assigned curated training-on-demand videos for core NAHASDA trainings

- Full FY22 Appropriations passed on March 10:
 - 19% Increase for formula IHBG; 50% increase for competitive IHBG

- FY2023 Budget (still reviewing)
 - Looks to be similar to FY2022 appropriations (chart above)
 - Provides \$7 million for USDA 502 Native CDFI relending demonstration
- Leadership Institute
 - Tentatively have 7 courses scheduled in 2022 (typical pre-covid level)
 - Hosting a course during Annual Convention
 - Held 3 in-person courses in 2021
 - Basic Accounting course held in Tulsa, Oklahoma in July
 - Pathways Course held in DC in October
 - Admissions & Occupancy course held at Legal Symposium
 - Indian Housing Management course is available online
 - Pathways Homebuyer Education course also available online
 - TTA team selected a few programs active in Pathways to test in fall 2021
 - Provides training to the Housing professional & can be used with individuals in the community
 - Hopeful to produce 2-3 LI courses each year moving forward; Admissions & Occupancy and NTCCP are finalizing development
 - Targeting the full development of one certification track
- NAIHC Rehab Grant (2020)
 - NAIHC awarded grants to 20 tribes for Rehab of Senior-owned at the beginning of 2020

- Work still ongoing in many communities due to COVID, extensions have been provided
- NAIHC COVID Housing Assistance Grant (NEW for 2021)
 - In March 2021, NAIHC awarded 19 grants to tribes for COVID-related housing projects, up to \$44,000 per tribe
 - About ½ of the awards have been closed out

NAIHC Events:

- 2022 Legislative Conference Postponed
 - Originally Scheduled for February 14-15-16
 - Postponing due to covid surge and tribal travel restrictions
 - Moving in-person event to week of September 19th
 - Possibly hosting virtual session in spring
- 2022 Annual Convention and Members Meeting: May 16-17-18-19, Seattle, WA
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- 2022 Legal Symposium: December 12-13-14, Las Vegas
 - Back to Bally's
 - Bulk of content is Tuesday/Wednesday (13th-14th)

Other Meetings/Trainings:

- HUD Housing Summit
 - Working with HUD/ONAP on bigger event
 - HUD now leaning towards mix of virtual and in-person events in 2022
- HUD Regional Trainings:
 - Still finalizing full 2022 HUD Trainings Schedule (~50 trainings)
 - Check NAIHC's website/calendar
 - Adding new online trainings sessions almost every week

Update on Pending HUD Grants/COVID Funding

- FY 2021 ICDBG-ARP (covid relief) (\$280M), NOFA is out, phased application process
 - All awards have been made
- FY21 ICDBG (\$70M) NOFA is out
 - Deadline was October 25
 - No award announcements yet
- FY21 IHBG Competitive (\$100M) NOFA is out
 - Original Deadline of December 1 extended to January 4

- No award announcements yet
- FY22 Grants: Full year funding just enacted, no NOFAs published

Treasury Funds

- Emergency Rental Assistance funding (meant to follow IHBG allocation formula)
 - \circ \$800M for tribal Rental Assistance coming from U.S. Treasury Department
 - Tribes should have money now
 - Tribes can provide rental and utility assistance (including arrears) to members 80% AMI and other eligibility requirements
 - Must be spent by September 30, **2022** (original deadline of Sept 2021 was extended by American Rescue Plan passed in March)
 - Reallocations could from tribal grantees (to other tribes) could begin in April
 - Some tribes have received reallocations from non-tribal grantees
 - 2nd round of Reallocation included 20+ tribes receiving more ERAP funds
 - o Operated through Treasury Department, constantly updating guidelines
 - Through December 31, 2021, tribes have reported \$183.8 M in expenses (23%)
 - Next data release should include March 31 reporting
- Homeowner Assistance Fund ~\$500 M
 - 5% set-aside of larger national program (\$498M)
 - Operated through Treasury, Similar to Emergency Rental Assistance Program
 - Tribal allocations follow IHBG formula (mechanism allows non-IHBG tribes to claim allocation as well)
 - Applications:
 - Tribes had to submit their intent to claim their HAF allocation by December 15, 2021.
 - As of March 21, 39 tribal HAF plans have been approved

<u>Legislative Updates:</u> NAHASDA Reauthorization

<u>Senate Side:</u>

- S. 2264 introduced June 24, with 9 bipartisan sponsors;
- Schatz, Murkowski, Tester and Hoeven lead sponsors
- Bill is similar to prior Senate version:
 - The bill would reauthorize NAHASDA programs through 2031 and update several key provisions such as: creating an Assistant Secretary for Indian Housing at HUD; re-establishing a Drug Elimination program for tribal communities; consolidating environment review requirements; allowing student housing assistance; recognizing tribal sovereignty to govern maximum rent requirements; allowing tribal housing programs to access the IHS sanitation funding; make tribes eligible for HUD Housing Counseling grants; reauthorizing Native Hawaiian housing programs; and other updates
- S.2264 was added to the Senate-passed 2021 National Defense Authorization Act, but the House did not agree (due to lack of Freedmen provisions requested by Chairwoman Waters)
 - First time Senate passed NAHASDA reauthorization since 2008!

<u>House-side:</u>

- Maxine Waters has introduced a NAHASDA bill, HR. 5195, which contains the Freedmen provision and authorization caps for each FY year 2021-2025 (go up each year, starting at \$680M in FY22 and ending at \$820M in FY26
- NAIHC supports reauthorization but concerned with authorization caps and Freedmen language
- Maxine Waters voted bill out of Committee on Sept 14 along party lines
- Next step would be full House vote, nothing is pending and NAIHC would not support the bill without changes to the authorization caps and resolution of the Freedmen issue
- Other than two issues above, the bill has great provisions for tribes including: 184 court jurisdiction fix issues, USDA tribal set-asides, flood mapping insurance program fix, homebuyer counseling grants eligibility, increased TDC allowances for energy efficient homes, and other small non-NAHASDA improvements

<u>Other NAHASDA bills:</u> NAHASDA is also included in American Housing and Economic Mobility Act (10-year reauth, \$2.5 Billion in first year, tribal access to section 8 vouchers)

HUD-VASH

- No bill introduced yet
- Last Congress, bill passed the Senate but not the House
- Is included in the larger NAHASDA efforts
- This Congress, NAIHC will again push for stand-alone and NAHASDA HUD-VASH provisions, work with House Leadership on getting bill finalized

USDA Re-lending Bill

- S. 2092 introduced June 16 with eight bipartisan cosponsors
- Lead sponsors are Senator Tina Smith (MN) and Senator Mike Rounds (SD)
- Bill would provide \$50M from USDA Single Family Home Loan program to Native CDFIs to provide home loans in tribal communities

Other Housing Bills

- FY 2022 Appropriations
 - Full FY22 funding passed on March 10
 - Budget: Biden Administration budget asked for \$1B in total (compared to ~\$825M last year combined for IHBG, Competitive IHBG, ICDBG, HUD-VASH)
 - Congress appropriations included total budget request:
 - Funds IHBG at \$772M; \$150M IHBG Competitive, \$70M ICDBG
 - NAIHC annually asks for nearly \$1 billion in annual IHBG alone
 - Funding is improvement, but still needs growth
- FY 2023 Appropriations Cycle
 - Budget Released in March 28th
 - Relatively Keeps Gains of FY22 funding
 - Work with Appropriations Committees/Members
- Infrastructure Bill
 - Bipartisan Deal that passed in fall 2021 did not include housing
 - President Biden released his \$2 trillion infrastructure proposal, "Build Back Better" which included \$213 billion for housing nationally
 - Biden Administration proposal provided on July 8 Leg Cmte call:
 - \$650 M IHBG Formula
 - \$350 M ICDBG
 - \$1 Billion IHBG Competitive
 - Democrats are moving ahead with larger package under "Budget Reconciliation" process which only needs Dem support and can pass without any Republican support
 - Build Back Better bill not expecting to pass
- Broken Promises bill
 - Last Congress, Congresswoman Haaland and Senator Warren led effort on large Native programs bill, responding to US Civil Rights Commission report on lack of funding for tribal programs.
 - Senator Warren is expected to lead this effort again this Congress
- Other legislative topics for tribal housing include:
 - Drug risks/Remediation funding (NAICH Resolution 2018-02)
 - Housing & Infrastructure connection (NAIHC Res. 2019-04)
 - Homeownership program improvements
 - 502 Single Family Loan, other USDA programs (NAIHC Res. 2018-01)

- Senator Smith and Rounds introduced this bill on June 16 (just 502 set-aside)
- NADL improvements (NAIHC Res. 2019-03)
- Section 8 and LIHTC improvements (NAIHC Res. 2018-03 & 2018-04)
 - Last Congress, bills did include restoring tribal access voucher program
 - Current VAWA bill envisions Emergency Vouchers being used in tribal units
